June 18-20, 2009

BINT570 A NEW TESTAMENT STUDY OF GRACE by Rev. Larry W. Linkous. A study in living the Christian life in the arena of God's Grace. The study centers on reformation (Hebrews 9:10) and challenges the student to discard cumbersome religious irrelevance that would entangle the believer's life in old covenant law and external fleshly criteria. The study brings enlightenment to many areas of difficulty in Hebrews and gives the student a clear and balanced understanding of the believer's security in light of the value God places on the blood of Jesus and the cross.

August 27-29, 2009

BIHT730 GREAT CHRISTIAN WRITERS OF THE TWENTIETH CENTURY by Rev. Gary Beasley. This course teaches the theological and historical impact of ten books identified by Christianity Today magazine as the best Christian books of the twentieth century. This course will inspire the student to make the reading of great books a lifestyle while highlighting the lessons contained in each of the ten books.

September 24-26, 2009

BICC150 INTRODUCTION TO BIBLICAL COUNSELING by Dr. Mike Chapman. This course examines the biblical principles of human personality and how personal change occurs. Special focus is placed on the church as God's healing institution, the unique features of Christian counseling and the development of a biblical approach to counseling.

October 22-24, 2009

BIPT341 CRUCIFIED LIFE by Dr. Sam Drye. This is a study of scriptural self-denial. It helps the student to gain a greater understanding of the centrality of the cross and identification with the death of Christ as the means to a victorious life.

November 26-28, 2009

BINT636 THE LORD'S PRAYER by Dr. Ronald E. Cottle. This is a study of the prayer Jesus taught His disciples to pray. Emphasis is placed upon the overall purpose of prayer. Each petition is analyzed for its deepest meaning and application for today is made.

January 28-30, 2010

BIHT430 THE THEOLOGY OF LOVE by Dr. David Alsobrook. The purpose of this course is to teach believers the importance of loving each other and mankind in general. The student will study love from a theological basis, discovering what love is and how to demonstrate it.

February 25-27, 2010

BIOT350 THE MINOR PROPHETS by Dr. Ian Bond. This course is a survey of the last twelve books of the Old Testament known as the Minor Prophets. It covers the history of God's people during the period of the ninth to the sixth centuries before Christ. Highlights include the historical background, the primary message and the application of each of the books.

March 25-27, 2010

BIHT622 HISTORY OF CHRISTIANITY IN AMERICA II by Dr. Stephen Mansfield. This course introduces and explains the origin and growth of Christianity in America beginning with the American Revolution and ending with the 1980s. Emphasis is placed upon significant events and times as viewed from a biblical and Christian perspective.

April 22-24, 2010

BIPT606 THE THEOLOGY OF SPIRITUAL AUTHORITY by Dr. Gary Kisner. This is a study of spiritual authority. Special emphasis is placed upon God's direct and delegated authority, and His required response to each. The course will examine biblical examples of rebellion against and obedience to God's authority. Also considered in some depth are the relationships between suffering and authority, the importance of being under authority, the proper attitudes of authorities and relationships governed by authority.

May 27-29, 2010

BIPT542 THE THEOLOGY OF BIBLICAL FREEDOM by **Dr. Michael Sedler**. The concept of freedom has become a cornerstone of our Christian desires and lives. This course will help us to understand the foundations of biblical freedom. What does freedom mean for a Christian? In this course each student will gain a clear understanding of the barriers to finding freedom and how we can walk a straight path toward freedom. By examining the lives of several key people of the Bible, obtaining freedom in the midst of trials will be understood. This course will help each person to identify his or her own personal barriers to freedom. In addition, we will learn to develop a personal plan for walking in freedom throughout our lives.

June 17-19, 2010

BIPT525 THE LETTERS OF JOHN by **Dr. Ian Bond**. This is an in-depth study of the Letters of John, which were written to believers who were uncertain about their spiritual status because of an unsettling conflict with the teachers of a false doctrine – Cerinthianism, which was a forerunner of second century Gnosticism.

August 26-28, 2010

BICC250 YOU CAN BE EMOTIONALLY HEALED by **Dr. Morris Sheats**. This course explores the biblical realm of emotional healing. Subjects addressed include healing of the memories, broken dreams, suffering, fear and depression. Solid, practical, biblical answers are presented in this course.

September 23-25, 2019

BIPT515 SPIRITUAL GIFTS by **Dr. Ronald E. Cottle**. This is a study of all the gifts of the Holy Spirit in the Scripture. Special emphasis is placed upon the nine charismatic gifts listed in I Corinthians 12-14.

October 21-23, 2010

BIPT511 NEW TESTAMENT THEOLOGY by **Dr. Ian Bond**. This course is a study of the methodology and selected basic themes of New Testament theology, their relation to the Old Testament, and their relevance for the mission and message of the contemporary Church.

November 18-20, 2010

BIPT545 A THEOLOGY OF WORSHIP by **Dr. Fuchsia Pickett**. This course demonstrates the pathway to a deeper, fuller, more satisfying relationship with God. It teaches you to embrace the heavenly Father in worship and experience the fullness of all He has for you. You will learn how pure spiritual worship positions you to receive God Himself and His blessings for you, empowers you for God-filled action, protects you from the attacks of the enemy, prepares your heart to receive God's heart, guides your steps victoriously and opens doors to His glory.

January 27-29, 2011

BIOT525 OLD TESTAMENT THEOLOGY by **Dr. Ian Bond**. This course is a study of the methodology and selected basic themes of the Old Testament theology, their relation to the New Testament theology and their relevance for the mission and message of the contemporary Church.

February 24-26, 2011

BIPT690 RELATIONAL TEAMBUILDING by **Dr. David Baldwin**. This course deals with the development of informal and formal teams at home, work and church. It states the importance of building synergistic relationships and explores the teams in both the workplace and in the Church. The course gives the biblical pattern of team-based ministry throughout the Old and New Testaments. It shares insights into the practical benefits and real reasons why teams succeed or fail. Teambuilding tips, techniques and tendencies of highly effective teams are given along with a practical look at how to troubleshoot and solve team problems.

March 24-26, 2011

BIHT602 WORLD RELIGIONS IN CHRISTIAN PERSPECTIVE by **Dr. Stephen Mansfield**. This course is designed to provide an overview of the primary religions and philosophies shaping our world and to evaluate them from a Christian perspective. Specific reference is made to these non-Christian religions as they are illustrated in film and contemporary literature. An apologetic approach to each religion and philosophy is also provided.
