CLASS SCHEDULE & COURSE DESCRIPTION

2010

August 26-28, 2010

BICC250 YOU CAN BE EMOTIONALLY HEALED by Dr. Morris Sheats. This course explores the biblical realm of emotional healing. Subjects addressed include healing of the memories, broken dreams, suffering, fear and depression. Solid, practical, biblical answers are presented in this course.

September 23-25, 2010

BIBT515 SPIRITUAL GIFTS by Dr. Ronald E. Cottle. This is a study of all the gifts of the Holy Spirit in the Scripture. Special emphasis is placed upon the nine charismatic gifts listed in I Corinthians 12-14.

October 21-23, 2010

BIPT641 SPIRITUAL DECEPTION: A BIBLICAL STUDY by Dr. Michael Sedler. This is a study of the impact upon a life when one is involved in listening to or spreading gossip, slander or other forms of evil reports. Emphasis will be placed upon the repercussions that occur within a life and how it impacts those around us. The different levels of defilement that lead to deception will be investigated. Specific biblical examples will be utilized to help each student grasp the seriousness of the issue. Practical, biblical strategies and interventions will be presented to aid each person in resisting the trap of the enemy.

November 18-20, 2010

BIBT105 BACK TO BASICS by Dr. Judson Cornwall. This course is a primer for understanding the Bible doctrines that shape and motivate our Christian living. The course focuses on the basics of the Scriptures, salvation, Christian culture, the Holy Spirit, Christian ceremony, faith, worship, healing, our enemy, righteousness, peace, joy, prayer, giving, ministry, heaven and hell.

January 27-29, 2011

BIOT611 PEARLS OF WISDOM FROM THE PROVERBS by Rev. Greg Hinnant. This course is an in-depth exposition of twenty selected proverbs of divine wisdom touching on a broad range of timelessly vital subjects – motives, conscience, attitudes, speech, laziness, parenting, judgment, gifts, teaching, leadership, faithfulness, and so forth – and a full application of their principles and practical lessons to Christian thinking, living and ministry.

February 24-26, 2011

BIHT602 WORLD RELIGIONS IN CHRISTIAN PERSPECTIVE by Dr. Stephen Mansfield. This course is designed to provide an overview of the primary religions and philosophies shaping our world and to evaluate them from a Christian perspective. Specific reference is made to these non-Christian religions as they are illustrated in film and contemporary literature. An apologetic approach to each religion and philosophy is also provided.

March 24-26, 2011

BICC510 EXPERIENCING FATHER'S EMBRACE by Rev. Jack Frost. This course is designed to lead you deeply into Father's presence where you can receive the very thing you've been crying out for your entire life – an experience in Father's loving embrace and a restoration of childlike innocence and intimacy.

April 28-30, 2011

BINT525 THE LETTERS OF JOHN by Dr. Ian Bond. This is an in-depth study of the Letters of John, which were written to believers who were uncertain about their spiritual status because of an unsettling conflict with the teachers of a false doctrine – Cerinthianism, which was a forerunner of second century Gnosticism.

May 26-28, 2011

BIPT690 RELATIONAL TEAMBUILDING by Dr. David Baldwin. This course deals with the development of informal and formal teams at home, work and church. It states the importance of building synergistic relationships and explores the teams in both the workplace and in the Church. The course gives the biblical pattern of team-based ministry throughout the Old and New Testaments. It shares insights into the practical benefits and real reasons why teams succeed or fail. Teambuilding

tips, techniques and tendencies of highly effective teams are given along with a practical look at how to troubleshoot and solve team problems.

June 16-18, 2011

BIOT660 GENESIS AND THE GRACE OF GOD by **Dr. Charles Gaulden**. The prevailing undercurrent of this course will focus on God's grace in confrontation with man's sin, from Adam to Jacob. Physical geography, biblical archaeology, the typology from Adam to Joseph will also be discussed. Likewise, the presence of Christ will also be studied in the appearance of the angel of the Lord. This study of the book of Genesis will provide historical perspective and an introduction to the rest of Scripture.

August 25-27, 2011

BIBT901 INTRODUCTION TO CHRISTIAN EVIDENCES by **Dr. Mike Chapman**. This course is designed to help the student gain a basic understanding of the field of Christian apologetics and answer legitimate questions concerning vital areas of Christian doctrine leading to a stronger faith.

September 29-October 1, 2011

BIPT335 EXPERIENCING AND ENCOUNTERING THE HOLY SPIRIT by **Dr. Larry Keefauver**. This course will present the biblical truths and principles for understanding the person and work of Holy Spirit in scripture and encountering Him personally through exploring the Word, examining one's present relationship and moving toward deepening one's relationship with Him.

October 27-29, 2011

BINT211 ROMANS I: WRATH TO RIGHTEOUSNESS by **Dr. Ronald E. Cottle**. This course is a study of Romans 1-3. The English text is used with insights from the Greek. Emphasis is placed upon the power of the Gospel, faith, the wrath of God and righteousness.

November 24-26, 2011

BICC525 BIBLICAL BUILDING BLOCKS FOR MARRIAGE AND FAMILY by **Rev Scott/Cheryl Scheer**. This is a study about God's kingdom purpose for the creation and plan for family. This course will establish a scriptural understanding of God's will and direction concerning relationship, marriage, propagation and parenting. It will explore some of the problems that have caused the destruction of the family. The course will establish a creed, confession and faith as it relates to integrity, covenant-commitment with marriage and strong, godly families within the Christian household.

January 26-28, 2012

BINT422 ROMANS II: NEW LIFE IN CHRIST by **Dr. Ronald E. Cottle**. This course is an exegetical study of Romans 5-8. The English text is used with insights from the Greek. Emphasis includes the new life of the believer, righteousness by faith, justification and the law of sin and death.

February 23-25, 2012

BIHT630 HERESY AND THE DEVELOPMENT OF CHRISTIAN DOCTRINE by **Dr. Stephen R. Crosby**. This course is an introductory level examination of the development of orthodox doctrine during the first 500 years of Church history with emphasis on Trinitarian and Christological issues. Doctrinal development will be traced by examining various doctrinal disputes the Church fathers handled during this time, from both within and without the "orthodox" Church.

March 29-31, 2012

BIOT525 OLD TESTAMENT THEOLOGY by **Dr. Ian Bond**. This course is a study of the methodology and selected basic themes of the Old Testament theology, their relation to the New Testament theology and their relevance for the mission and message of the contemporary Church.

April 26-28, 2012

BIBT108 THEOLOGY: THE NATURE, ESSENCE AND ATTRIBUTES OF GOD by **Dr. Mike Chapman**. This course will explore the Christian doctrine of God. Emphasis will be placed on an apology for God's existence, the biblical description of His nature and divine essence. The divine Trinity will be discussed as well as the biblical names of God and the unique works of God as outlined for us in Scripture
